Based in New York City, **Charles Alsdorf** is the Capital Efficiency leader for Deloitte Advisory and is a director of Deloitte Transactions and Business Analytics LLP. He has nearly 25 years of experience in valuation, strategy, decision analysis and corporate finance, and focuses his practice on evaluating strategic investment decisions in times of volatility and change. He was also one of the recipients of Deloitte’s Eminence Fellowship program for his work in capital efficiency. Prior to joining Deloitte FAS, Charles served as vice president of technology strategy for Standard & Poor’s bond rating business with global responsibility for setting strategy on technology, quantitative analytics and data operations. Before that he was director of valuation for a global professional services firm. He has worked extensively with clients in energy, infrastructure, natural resources, technology, financial services and the public sector. He also served as financial advisor on privatization and project finance transactions and completed numerous engagements in

such countries as Russia, Georgia, Hungary, Poland, South Africa, China, Australia, Canada, Ecuador, Brazil and Argentina.



Kim Cannon lives in Big Horn, Wyoming, and is an attorney with the firm Davis & Cannon, which he joined after law school (University of Colorado, 1974), becoming a partner in 1980. He serves as the Director of Enrollment for Dartmouth College for Wyoming and served as the Chair of the Rhodes Scholarship Selection Committee for Wyoming (1997-2005). He currently serves on the boards of the International Academy of Trial Lawyers (to which he was elected as a Fellow in 2006), the Dartmouth Lawyers Association, and the Wyoming Institute for Humanities Research (at the University of Wyoming), the Big Horn Equestrian Center, and the Big Horn Mountain Roundup.



Susan Miller is passionate about theatre, the arts and historic buildings and devotes countless volunteer hours to these and other causes. She is a 2014 graduate of Leadership Wyoming.
